
# Murphy Class Newsletter

We play outside in **all weathers.** As the colder weather draws closer, please ensure that your child has appropriate <u>named</u> clothing (waterproof coat, hats, scarves, gloves etc.), as well as a bag of <u>named</u> spare clothes (including socks) so that they can fully engage in all of our wonderful outdoor provision. **This bag can stay in school**.

If your child has their own waterproof suit, this can be really useful to have in school to protect their clothing when playing in our very messy areas like the mud kitchen, clay and large water areas. These areas are fantastic for developing lots of concepts which support children's mathematical understanding, as well as skills for writing - they really get the most out of this provision when they are able to fully immerse themselves in it!
