Key facts

- Leeds is a city in the country of England.
- England is in the United Kingdom
- The United Kingdom is in the continent of Europe along with countries like Spain, France and Greece.
- There are seven continents:
 - Europe
 - Asia
 - · Africa
 - · North America
 - · South America
 - · Antarctica
 - Australia (also known as Australasia and Oceania)
- There are five oceans:
 - · Pacific ocean
 - · Atlantic ocean
 - · Indian ocean
 - Southern ocean
 - · Arctic ocean
- The further away from the Equator you travel, the colder it gets. Some continents have very hot weather and some have very cold weather.
- Sailors used a compass to find their way across the oceans. We use the words North, South, East and West to describe the direction we are travelling in.


Black beard was an English pirate who travelled by boat to the West Indies and North America.





Parents as partners:
