Key facts

- After WW2, Britain needed more men and women to work in industry because of a shortage of workers.
- The British government advertised for people to come and help to re-build the country.
- At the time, Caribbean countries were colonies that were part of the British Empire and therefore the people were British citizens.
- Empire Windrush brought the first large group of West Indian immigrants to the UK.
- People travelled thousands of miles across the Atlantic from the Caribbean to Britain.
- People were told that they would find a better way of life.
- When they arrived, many immigrants were not given equal rights or opportunities.
- Many of them experienced racism and discrimination.
- In recent years, many of the original Windrush settlers and their families were threatened with removal from the UK because the government had not given them the correct paperwork.

Did you know?

The Empire Windrush, originally called the Monte Rosa, was a passenger liner and cruise ship launched in Germany in 1930.



The ship sank in the Mediterranean Sea in March 1954, after a fire on board.

Map of The Caribbean


