• Animals need food, water and air in order to survive.

- Animals have offspring that grow into adults
- A chicken lays an egg, a chick emerges from the egg and grows into a chicken.
- A butterfly lays an egg, a caterpillar emerges from the egg, the caterpillar pupates in a chrysalis and butterfly emerges from the chrysalis.
- A human gives birth to a baby, a baby grows into a toddler, a toddler grows into a child and a child grows into an adult.
- A frog lays frogspawn, a tadpole grows inside the frogspawn, the tadpole emerges from the frogspawn, the tadpole develops into a frog.




